CCDBG PROGRAM SERVICES

The CIMC Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) Program provides the following services:

- → Payments to child care providers
- → Resource materials
- → Training and technical assistance for child care providers

APPLICATION PROCESS

Parents/guardians may contact the CIMC CCDBG Program or the local Tribal contact person for an application. Documentation will be required to support proof of eligibility.

CHILD CARE CERTIFICATE

Upon approval, a Child Care Certificate will be issued to the parent/guardian. The Certificate identifies the number of hours, approved child(ren), hourly/daily maximum rate, parent/guardian share of cost and valid dates.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Parents/guardians, children and child care providers must meet the following eligibility requirements:

Parent:

- residing on or near the participating reservation/rancheria (near means within the county in which the reservation/rancheria is located) or within the service area defined by the participating Tribe
- → income level below 85 percent of the State Median Income Level
- → working or attending a vocational or education/training program

Child:

- → member of a participating Tribe
- → under age 13; or over age 13 and under age 18 and disabled
- → residing with parent/guardian or receiving protective services

Provider:

- → registered with CIMC CCDBG Program
- → meets applicable State/Tribal licensing requirements
- → if license-exempt, meets CCDBG health and safety standards

PROVIDER REQUIREMENTS

Providers who are not subject to State/ Tribal/other licensing requirements must comply with the CIMC CCDBG Program health and safety standards to be approved as child care providers prior to receiving payment. Center-based and Group Home Care facilities must meet applicable State/Tribal licensing requirements.

Parents will share in the cost of their child care based on the CIMC CCDBG Sliding Fee Scale.

The CIMC CCDBG Program uses the same payment rates as those used by the CCDBG Program operated by the State of California. Such rates are the regional market rate ceiling for California child care providers. These rates are updated annually.
